• UML (1997): common set of modeling constructs and notations



• Rumbaugh, Booch and Jacobson

(tres amigos)

- NOT a development process
- V1.5 (2003) ----- V2.0 (2004)





- Provide expressive (visual) modelling language
- Be independant of
 - programming language
 - process
- Encourage OO tools market





- Flexible and extensible
 - OCL (Object Contraint Language)
 - UML Profiles
- Support higher-level reuse concepts





- UML is NOT a development process
- OO Development processes
 - (R)UP : Rational Unified Process (1999)
 - Extreme Programming
 - DSDM
 - Scrum





